Spotlight on East Bloomfield Recreation Director

......Summer Recreation Continues to Improve

In 2002, the East Bloomfield Town Supervisor was looking for a new Summer Recreation Director. At that time, the summer program was located at Bloomfield Central Schools, at either campus. A young Bloomfield Elementary School Teacher, Jeff Daley, was interested in the job and soon became the new director the town was seeking. On Friday August 2, 2019, Jeff Daley will have completed his seventeenth consecutive year as summer recreation director.

"I grew up going to camp" Jeff recalled as we sat down to discuss his extensive tenure as East Bloomfield Town Recreation Director. "For nine years I attended Camp Stella Maris on Conesus Lake and loved every minute of it. At age fifteen I became a camp counselor working at JCC Camp Sisol. I held that job for seven consecutive summers." Beyond that stretch of counseling Jeff was a camp educator at Keuka College for Mind stretchers, a summer experience for gifted and talented youth. "As you can see, summer camp for kids is part of my DNA", he reflected.

As he began the East Bloomfield Summer Recreation job, he recalled with a gleam in his eye, "my goal was to take an ordinary summer rec program and turn it into an extraordinary program". Daley began to revamp the program by introducing rotational stations. He said, "We went from controlled chaos to a meaningful structure". The stations included science for kids, arts and crafts, boogie time, consisting of music art and drama, as well as athletics. Each grade of students moved from one center of discovery and play to another. It was a combination of creativity and structure that emerged as a perfect blend for kids.

When Daley began as director there had been a previous year's enrollment of 88 campers in the summer of 2001. He told then Supervisor Pat Crowley there would

be at least 100 summer campers in 2002 or Pat could replace him with someone else the following year. In his first-year enrollment topped out at 187 campers or a net increase of 99 youth. Daley had secured his position and has never looked back. This year 2019 the Town enrolled 160 children in the program and according to Daley" things could not be better".

The final segment is a series of questions and answers between Jeff Daley and the Supervisor:

Supervisor: What is the identity of the East Bloomfield Summer recreation program?

Daley: It is a two-pronged identity and always been that way. The first part is what we call FAMILY. We are a family of campers, staff and volunteers and we support each and every child according to their needs and talents. All children have individual differences and we celebrate, recognize and support their uniqueness.

Supervisor: And the second part?

Daley: It is a MAGICAL program and a MAGICAL place. We design programs and create activities for campers that can be seen through their eyes as magic. All children believe in magic and that is the daily environment we nourish. It is a great little melting pot.

Supervisor: Describe the structure of the Summer Rec Program

Daley: We currently have an enrollment of 160 campers for 2019. These campers are supported by volunteers, counselors, specialists, assistant director, nurse and a director. We work as a collaborative team to offer highly interactive and exciting programs. We are located in Veterans Park it has been our home since the Town purchased the American Legion Building. We use the outdoor athletic fields, all rooms in the annex as well as the open fields and contemporary playground and basketball court.

Supervisor: As you reflect on 17 years as director what comes to mind? **Daley:** The Heart of Camp Award in memory of Fahris Wyand is so important to our identity. She embodied everything we value. The annual camper of the year awards is an important recognition and these campers are nominated by the staff. These awards are given out on the last day of camp each year. We have also raised \$ 18,000.00 in funds for Make a Wish and Scholarships over the past 17 years and I am very proud of that accomplishment. No child is ever turned away from our program.

Supervisor: Any final thoughts?

Daley: I consider myself a lucky person to have had this position for the past 17 years. It is an extraordinary program due to the team of counselors, volunteers, assistant director as well as nurse and parents. I am truly humbled by the spirit our team brings to camp each day.

Residents & Friends,

Hope everyone's summer has been as good as ours here at the Highway Dept. The Highway Dept. crew has not skipped a beat completing summer tasks even with the very up & down weather conditions this summer from monsoon's to extreme heat. Scheduling has been crazy this year trying to get work done but we are right on schedule with projects. All oil & stoning is done for the summer, except Brace Rd, which is going to be done mid-August due to the paving recycle job that was done in July. Numerous ditching jobs had to be done as a result of the amount of rain that fell in a short amount of time bringing all the sediment and natural debris that filled our ditches. Within the first few weeks of August, the north end of Flatiron Rd between Gauss and 5&20 will be boxed out, new sub base put in and then black topped by Ontario County Highway Dept., who is going to share services with

us by the use of their paver. This project is long over do. This fall we have scheduled a cross culvert replacement project on Wesley Rd that will be done before the fall foliage starts. The roadside mowing crew has also been extra busy due to rain and heat, which equals grass growing:):) Also when time permits, various jobs have been done with our town facilities at the Town Hall, Veterans Park, and at our Highway Dept.

I would like to say thank you to all for giving me the opportunity to serve and work for such a fantastic community and to make our Highway Department the best it can be. All of us at the Highway Department give 110% EVERYDAY, including myself, Scott Parker, Karl Rubenstein, Tripper Torno, Don Hall, Mike Lovejoy and our summer help, Gary Rogers.
