FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERVISOR

Dear Community Resident,

We have a wide variety of municipal projects scheduled for the Summer of 2016. Let's being with Veterans Park, the home of the East Bloomfield Recreation Program. Our registration this summer is 156 eager and motivated young girls and boys. Also, we are preparing a Consolidated Funding Application with the NYS Governor's Office. The focus of this application will be the reconstruction and remodeling of the former American Legion Building. This facility is heavily used and requires substantial infrastructure investment to maximize its use and to be compliant with building and safety codes.

Speaking of grants, we are pleased to announce that Senator Rich Funke has awarded the Town of East Bloomfield \$55,000 for a new outdoor playground structure at Veterans Park. We also received a \$7,500 grant from the Rochester Community Health Foundation for an outdoor basketball court at Veterans Park. This grant was awarded competitively and we were able to be successful despite the large number of municipalities that applied for funding. Furthermore, the East Bloomfield Highway Department is constructing a pathway around the perimeter of the athletic fields at Veterans Park. This pathway will be dressed with crushed cinder to make walking and running an enjoyable experience. After summer recreation concludes its five (5) week program this summer, the Town highway department will pave the parking lot at Veterans Park as well. Our vision is to provide a comprehensive town park that can be accessed by everyone in our community throughout the year. We eventually want to offer something for everyone at this site of natural beauty.

We were officially notified by the Office of the State Comptroller that the new water project on Whalen Road has been approved. We will be filing all the necessary paperwork and establishing a timeline for this project. It has taken some time to obtain approval and we are very pleased that is finally moving forward.

Water is critical to everyone whether it be agricultural, residential or commercial. As we plan for the short and long-term viability of East Bloomfield, investment in infrastructure is central to economic development, and water will be a foremost factor in that plan. After reading a draft of the Comprehensive Plan, a citizens advisory group was formed by Doug Turnbull and Paul Hudson. Their advisory group did a story board presentation at a Town board meeting recently. A number of interested citizens attended and we had an extended, respectful and thoughtful discussion on the future viability of East Bloomfield. The East Bloomfield Town board will continue in such deliberations and will propose the next steps for everyone

As Town Supervisor, I have been communicating with our Bloomfield Village Mayor, Mark Falsone. We look forward to a productive relationship and will work together on behalf of all residents in the Town and Village. We have a lot to be proud of in our corner of the Finger Lakes and we also realize that we must work hard to maintain that pride. Thank you for placing your trust and confidence in me. Have a wonderful summer with family - friends, wherever you go!

HELLO FROM THE HIGHWAY DEPT!

Summer has just begun but as of this writing our Highway Department has already completed the stone and oiling process of our roads scheduled for this year. Also completed was a large culvert replacement on Gauss Road, between Ashman and Oakmount, plus an upgraded guard rail to meet legal standards. As you may have noticed the paint truck has been around refreshing our paint on some of our roads for added safety.

Although it's only June, we are in our second round of roadside mowing on town owned roads. The County and State do their own mowing on County and State roads.

The Highway Department has been spending many hours at Veterans Park installing a walking path around the soccer and baseball fields. Once the Summer Recreation program starts up at the park, we will be moving on to road work.

The Town Hall has received a few questions about how decisions are made for road work. It's a function of the Highway Superintendent, and is part of a 5 year plan.

- The Town owns 44 miles of roads.
- Each year we try to rebuild at least one mile of road, which also includes all culverts and driveway pipes.
- An additional step taken is removal of all metal culverts for replacement with polyplastic culverts because plastic doesn't rust.
 This will save tax dollars with future drainage expenses.
- Each year we try to prep the roads for next years stone and oil with new black top. We try and do at least 7 miles or more each year. Also taken into consideration are resident concerns about drainage or road breakage, plus traffic flow and overall road usage.

On occasion, the best laid plans cannot be completed due to weather or material supply, so we have our summer work scheduled, but it can be thrown off quickly by excessive weather.

Each year the Highway Superintendent works with the Town Board to set the Highway Budget for the following year. The Budget covers not only the roads but also the equipment we need to do the work.

If there are any questions on the day to day operations of the Highway Department, I am always willing to take calls or sit down with you to answer any questions. I believe these are <u>our</u> roads in the "beautiful" Town of East Bloomfield.


