FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERVISOR

Dear Resident,

We exemplify life in small town America as residents of East
Bloomfield. Your local government has a paired responsibility in
that regard. The first part of that twosome is to deliver results for the people we
serve. The second goal second goal is a companion to the first. It is to solve
problems, protect the common welfare and provide opportunities for its people.
When both of these goals swing into action, the vibrant and vitality thrives and
multiplies.

We have very busy working together to create better opportunities across our community, including sharing services and ideas and resources between the town, village and school. I am going to provide you with a brief description of several initiatives that will translate into creating better opportunities for our community. All of these projects have been launched each contains a specific timeline along with actions taken to make progress. In order to ensure that each project is fully and successfully completed will require collaboration, communication and problem solving with numerous groups and individuals.

What follows is brief description for each initiative.

Town Water Study.

This study was conducted and completed by Chatfield Engineering Group in late 2108. Presentations were made and discussions were held about their findings. The study is available by going to our website www.townofeastbloomfield.org and click to "Water Department and scroll down and it is there for you to view or download. The next logical step would be to conduct a town wide survey to all residents who do not have water. That information would assist us in planning where to build out those water lines. The study also provides a cost breakdown as well as topographical designations in each neighborhood. Expansion of water is critical to economic development for commercial, agricultural and residential development.

Comprehensive Plan.

A dedicated group of citizens and staff have convened often over the past year to update and rewrite our comprehensive plan. The plan contains volumes of old and outdated information. As a result of this hard and smart work the group produced a completed "DRAFT" document. This group was led by Kathy Conradt who brought remarkable experience to the table from her successful career in Bloomfield Village Government. We are currently in communication with John Steinmetz who will convert the draft document into a finished product. At that time the East Bloomfield

Planning Board and Town Board will have current and functional guide to planning zoning and development, once it is presented to the community for public comment. The members of the Comprehensive Planning team are Kathy Conradt, Gail Harrington, Jim Kier, Paul Hudson, Caroline Nevil, Ron Newell, Mike Woodruff, Tom Kugris, Dave Damaske and Fred Wille.

Town Court Grant.

The town of East Bloomfield Court was awarded a grant for the purpose of improving our court facility and security. It is part of the grant cycle of 2018-2019 from the Justice Court Assistance Program (also known as "JCAP"). East Bloomfield Town Court was one of 308 courts in New York State receiving funding this year. These funds will enhance our critical mission to administer justice in our facilities. It is also important to know that this award is the maximum allowable funding for a municipal court. We are very proud of the judicial team at East Bloomfield Court, namely Margaret Gochenaur, Court Clerk, Russ Kenyon, Judge and Robert Montgomery, Judge. We also have an Ontario County Sheriff assigned to our court as bailiff. In addition to East Bloomfield holding court, West Bloomfield holds court in our facilities as well. This the second year for this shared services agreement.

American Legion Building at Veterans Park.

The East Bloomfield Town Board awarded the general contract bid to John McKinnon Construction Company, Honeoye Falls NY. McKinnon was the low bidder. The American legion Building is about 44 years old and the infrastructure has experienced gradual decline. The town has already abated the asbestos, replaced the windows and upgraded the security system. When the project is completed it will provide the community with an attractive and contemporary facility. Work is expected to be completed before summer 2019.

Website Development.

East Bloomfield has recently completed a comprehensive overhaul of our town website. This important technology project was undertaken by IC-9 Design. Between the snow & ice and all the work that comes with it.
Shoveling, bundling up against the cold, sledding, skiing, and building snowmen. Keeping the roads free of snow & ice and as safe as we



Highway Departments priority. We here at the Highway Department have not only been busy with snow & ice events but have been busy doing outside weather permitted road work tasks such as: trimming brush, general shop maintenance, preventative maintenance on equipment and buildings. Lastly, working together as a team and preparing for Spring/Summer projects to make sure we can be as efficient and cost effective as possible.

We have been working on our safety requirements. All mandated requirements have been brought up to where they need to be as town employees. As Highway Superintendent, and residents, we all should be very proud and fortunate of the crew we have working on our roads doing daily activities. Scott, Tripper, Karl, Mike and Donny go above and beyond every day to make operations of the Highway Department the best and safest they possibly can. I believe team work; community input, and constructive criticism equals success.

Mailboxes:

Mailboxes shall be installed according to the United States postal service guidelines. The distance from center line of road to front of the 4"x4" mailbox post should be a minimum of 17', with a 43" clearance to the bottom of the mailbox or structure support arm for our plow wing to pass under it. Property owners shall assume the responsibility of proper

placement and ensuring all components are free from rot deterioration, breakage, and are structurally sound in condition. If a mailbox meets all homeowner requirements and is damaged by a plow from the Town Highway Department please notify the Highway Department within 24 hours of said damage at (585) 657-7727 or (585) 278-7549. Once notified the Highway Department will repair it in a timely manner. Mailboxes that are knocked off due to deterioration condition, repairs/replacement will be the responsibility of the owner.

Safety Reminders:

Please do not follow town trucks too closely. Keep a safe distance behind any large vehicle and if you cannot see their side mirrors they can't see you.

Lastly, please feel free to contact me for any reason or question(s) on the daily operations of **OUR** Highway Department. If you see something whether it be a hazard, a needed repair, or improvement, always contact me, or stop by the Highway garage and let me know.

The leftover acoustic wall covering will be stored for use in the future theater/auditorium when it is

added to the museum.

The East Bloomfield code officer continues to examine preliminary architectural drawings for the ham station addition as they are developed prior to any meetings with the town planning board, guaranteeing compliance as the project continues to move forward.

Donations to the fund drive for the construction of the ham station, including a space for the registrar team relocation within a portion of this addition, have reached the 45% level with several major donations in addition to multiple membership donations received.
